

## **Roger Dickinson Announces Run for Sacramento City Council, District 2**

**Sacramento, CA** — Today, Roger Dickinson officially launched his campaign for Sacramento City Council, District 2. Roger will bring to the job the hard-earned experience of four decades representing Sacramento as a health, housing, and transportation advocate, educator, Sacramento County Supervisor, and State Assemblymember.

“We have strong and resilient neighborhoods in District 2 but find ourselves in extraordinary and challenging times,” said Dickinson, “I am committed to providing the leadership we need to build on our assets and bring new energy to our community.”

Roger Dickinson has been at the forefront of reform in Sacramento as an advocate for youth, the environment, job creation, and housing. With a history of creating innovative and empathetic solutions, Roger Dickinson will:

- Address homelessness by providing a full spectrum of services and housing and by supporting our neighbors before they become homeless.
- Make our streets, businesses, and homes safe by investing in true community-based interventions and policing and identifying the appropriate first responders for each situation.
- Bring home private and public investment for our neighborhoods and businesses to provide the vitality, quality, and character our communities deserve.
- Embrace all, especially our young people, with the opportunity and resources to contribute and flourish in building a stronger community.

Roger Dickinson currently serves as the Policy Director for CivicWell, providing direction and advocacy for the organization’s policies, programs, and priorities. In addition, he works with the Housing Concepts Coalition, which advocates for legislative and administrative steps to increase housing.

During Roger’s tenure as the Executive Director of Transportation California, he helped pass the Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2018, California’s largest transportation funding legislation. California now enjoys over \$5 billion annually in roads, bridges, and public transportation funding.

As a State Assemblymember representing Sacramento, Roger focused on environmental quality, education, health, and human services for children and families, economic development, and consumer protection, with the Governor signing forty-two of his bills signed into law. As a Sacramento Supervisor, he provided access to health care, economic development, cleaner air, and improved roads while balancing the budget every year.

Roger lives with his wife, Marj, live in the North Sacramento neighborhood of Woodlake, where they have owned a home for over 40 years.
